The ISO / ASA rating describes how quickly the film reacts to light. Also known as **film speed**. You usually purchase 100 or 400 speed film.

The higher the number the grainer the image.

The higher the number the more sensitive the film to light.



Controlling Exposure

In order for an image to be captured on film, it must be exposed to light. The camera has two settings that control light, and they work very similar to the human eye. **Shutter and Aperture**
